4. Anne Bonney and Mary Reed were famous female pirates of that time. They hid in a crew dressed as men.
5. Calico Jack attempted mutiny against Charles Vanes.
6. Captain Hornigold was a pirate that surrendered to the King's pardon and became a pirate hunter.
7. Woods Rogers was a pirate initially but was the catalyst for the end of slavery.

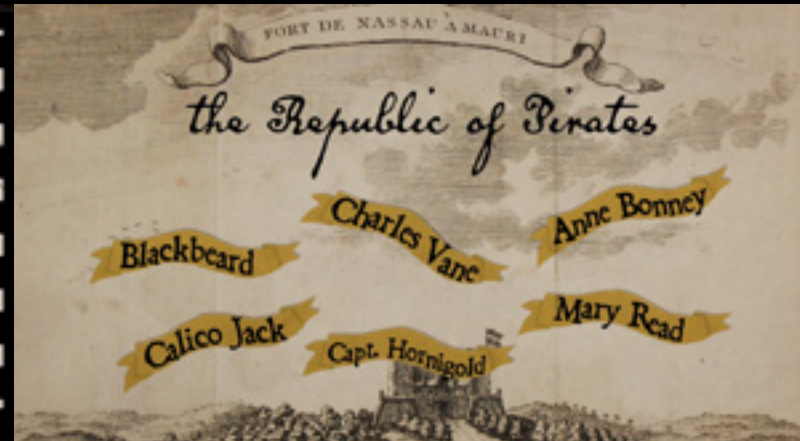
